Schemes At Construction	
Athlone, Co Westmeath	<p>Westmeath County Council to advance scheme having appointed consultants in April 2017. It is proposed that the projects will be delivered in a phased manner with cells progressing to planning and construction once all required studies and investigations have been completed to ensure works are completed in a timely fashion. Construction works on various cells commenced at the end of October 2017 and are ongoing.</p> <p>Please see www.athlonefas.ie for information on this scheme.</p>
Bandon, Co Cork	<p>A contractor has been appointed and construction commenced July 2016. Following mobilising activity and the procuring of licences/permits to commence works, works in a number of locations have progressed to date. The following is a summary of works progress to date:</p> <p>The Contractor, Wills Bros Ltd, commenced works on site in July, 2016. Current works progress includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Underpinning works at Bandon Bridge, until the end of September, 2018. - Old footbridge removed and new footbridge constructed which is now open to the public. - Flood defence walls and embankment works ongoing. <p>It is expected that the Scheme will be substantially completed by July, 2019.</p> <p>Please see www.bandonfrs.ie for more information on this scheme.</p>
Claregalway, Co Galway	<p>Works on the main Claregalway Scheme commenced in June 2016 and are currently underway with an expected substantial completion date of Q3 2019. Clonakilty, Co Cork	CFRAM consultants developed preferred scheme in mid 2013. Exhibition and Detailed Design stages are now complete. Scheme has been confirmed by DPER and procurement of the main contractor is progressing. Further information please see www.clonakiltyfrs.ie
Dodder Fluvial Phase 2c, 2d and 2e, Dublin City	Works commenced in Quarter 3 2013 and due to a number of additional works and unsound existing structures identified throughout the course of detailed site investigations, works were slightly delayed. Works are currently ongoing in Ballsbridge up to Donnybrook with substantial completion expected in Quarter 2 2019.
Dunkellin, Co Galway	Works on the main Dunkellin Scheme commenced in September 2016 and are ongoing with substantial completion expected in Q4 2018. Please see http://www.galway.ie/en/services/roads/dunkellindrainagedistrict/ for updates.
Ennis Lower, Co Clare	Construction works commenced May 2013 and are substantially completed. Some works in the town centre area still need to be constructed, and discussions with the landowner are at an advanced stage. Works in the Aughanteeroe and Fior Uisce areas have been completed.
Skibbereen, Co Cork	The Skibbereen Flood Relief Scheme is being advanced by Cork County Council as Contracting Authority under the Arterial Drainage Acts and is being funded by OPW. The contractor has been appointed and construction commenced in July, 2016. Works have been progressed at a number of locations. It is anticipated that construction of the Scheme will be completed in early 2019. Please see www.skibbereenfrs.ie for more information on this scheme.
Templemore, Co Tipperary	Construction on the Templemore Flood Relief Scheme began in June 2017 and are progressing well. Please see http://www.opw.ie/en/templemore/ for more information on this scheme.

Schemes at Planning

Arklow, Co Wicklow	A Feasibility Report, commissioned by Wicklow County Council has been completed and an Environmental Impact Statement commissioned by OPW is currently being finalised. Wicklow County Council held two Public Information Days in Arklow in November 2016 to afford the public an opportunity to view the proposed scheme works and to invite their comments / feedback in relation to these proposals. Some additional surveying is being carried out and liaison is taking place with Irish Water in relation to their proposed new Waste Water Treatment Plant. It is hoped to finalise all reports with a view to going for Planning Permission for a flood relief scheme in Q3 2018.
Ballymakeera, Co Cork	Outline design in ongoing with a view to holding a public exhibition in 2019.

Bellurgan, Co Louth	Louth County Council is advancing this scheme and works have commenced and will be completed in 2018.
Blackpool, Co Cork	The River Bride (Blackpool) CDS is being progressed by OPW in conjunction with Cork City Council, and main design consultant engineers, Arup. The Scheme was put to Public Exhibition in November 2015, with the preferred option of conveyance improvements along with some direct defences. The Scheme will protect 293 properties (206 residential and 87 commercial). Detailed design of the Scheme has been undertaken and the Scheme will be submitted to DPER for Confirmation in 2018. Camac River, Dublin	Significant flood remedial works were carried out by DCC in 2014 on the Camac river in Kilmainham under the Minor Flood Relief Works and Coastal Protection Scheme. This work consisted of the construction of almost 100 metres of new reinforced flood defence walls and the strengthening of existing walls at the rear of properties. This work has provided a high level of protection against flooding to the properties in this area. More comprehensive flood relief proposals for the Camac River are currently in the early stages of planning, with DCC and OPW working in partnership to ascertain how any works might be progressed. The Local Authority are to appoint consultants before the end of 2018.
Crossmolina, Co Mayo	The Crossmolina Flood Relief Scheme public exhibition was held in May 2018. The detailed design stage will commence once all public comments have been considered and replies are issued.
Douglas/Togher, Co Cork	Cork County Council as the contracting authority is progressing the Scheme with funding provided by The Office of Public Works. For information please go to the project website www.douglasfrs.ie
Ennis South, Co Clare	Clare County Council progressing scheme with funding from OPW. The recent tender competition had to be abandoned, and a new competition is due to be advertised shortly. It is hoped to commence construction in the 1st half of 2019.
Enniscorthy, Co Wexford	Enniscorthy Flood Relief Scheme has recently been displayed during Public Information sessions, and formal Exhibition is scheduled for later this year. It is expected to go for confirmation in 2019. Please see www.enniscorthyfds.ie for further information on this scheme.
Glanmire/Glashaboy, Co Cork	Cork County Council as the contracting authority is progressing this Scheme with funding provided by The Office of Public Works. For information please go to www.glashaboyfrs.ie .

Gort Lowlands	The Gort Lowlands scheme is being progressed by Galway County Council (GCC) who are acting as the Contracting Authority for the project with funding provided by the OPW. Engineering and Environmental consultants have been appointed and work on the options is on-going. Please see http://southgalwayfrs.ie/ for information on this scheme.
King's Island, Limerick City	Limerick City and County Council are progressing this Flood Relief Scheme, with funding provided by the Office of Public Works. It is currently being designed and it is hoped that it will go for planning approval in late 2018 / early 2019. For further information please see http://www.kingsislandfrs.ie/
Lower Lee (Cork City)	Public Exhibition commenced in November 2016 and completed in April 2017. A high volume of submissions were received which are currently being considered. Each submission will be responded to once further decisions are taken on the various issues raised. An agreement has been reached with Cork City Council to undertake advance works on Morrison's Island as part of Public Realm project. This was granted Part 8 Planning Permission in mid 2018 by Cork City Council.
Lower Morrell, Co Kildare	The Lower Morrell River scheme is being progressed by Kildare County Council (KCC) who are acting as the Contracting Authority for the project with funding provided by the OPW. The Scheme has been approved by Bord Pleanala and it is expected that works could commence in early 2019. Please see https://www.morellfms.ie/ for information on this scheme.
Midleton, Co Cork	The first Public Information Day was held on 23 March at Midleton Park Hotel. Scheme being advanced by Cork County Council (CCC). CCC have appointed a specialised contractor to treat invasive species – treatment has commenced. CCC have tendered for SI contractor. Tenders have been assessed and a preferred bidder identified.
Mountmellick, Co. Laois	Laois County Council, alongside the Office of Public Works (OPW), are in the process of procuring a consultant engineer to review the potential options which were identified in the OPW's Flood Risk Management Plan.
Poddle River, Dublin	The preferred proposals for flood mitigation measures on the River Poddle include; flood walls and embankments with flood storage in Tymon Park, culvert inlet screens, flap valves and sealed manholes. Consultants have now been appointed to undertake design. Construction to commence early 2020.
Portarlinton, Co. Laois	Laois County Council, alongside the Office of Public Works (OPW), are in the process of procuring a consultant engineer to review the potential options which were identified in the OPW's Flood Risk Management Plan.
Raphoe, Co Donegal	Consultants (Engineer and Environmental) were appointed in November 2017 to bring a scheme forward to planning. Work on the available options is ongoing. Please see http://raphoefrs.ie/ for information on this scheme.

Sandymount, Co Dublin	DCC are progressing a Flood Defence Scheme for Sandymount and are currently advancing the first phase through Part 8. Works are to commence in 2018 by OPW direct labour.
Skerries, Dublin	The Office of Public Works design section hopes to complete a Feasibility study in 2018.
Whitechurch, Dublin	OPW are in the early stages of design. Consultants will be procured from the All Dublin Framework for detailed design stage. Culvert surveys and hydrology assessments are currently underway. Construction expected to commence in 2019

Northlands, Co Meath	Meath County Council received planning approval for the works which were carried out by OPW direct staff. The Construction works are substantially complete.
Ballycullen, Dublin	Substantially Completed in 2017
South Campshires, Dublin City	Works are substantially complete. There are some minor outstanding items being completed by Dublin City Council.
Foynes, Co Limerick	Limerick County Council is Contracting Authority with funding provided by OPW. The scheme was substantially complete by mid 2017.
Bray, Co. Wicklow	Construction works commenced in March 2012 and were completed in 2017.
Waterford City Phases 2,3,4	The Saint John's River Flood Relief Scheme was carried out, in four phases, by Waterford City and County Council with funding provided by the Office of Public Works. All Phases are now complete. Some additional works are ongoing.
Fermoy South, Co Cork	Construction works commenced in March 2012 and were completed in mid 2015.
Wad River, Dublin City	Following extreme flood events on the River Wad in the Donnycarney area of Dublin City in 2008 and 2009, Dublin City Council (DCC) undertook a study on the River Wad catchment to investigate the problem and recommended possible solutions. The study recommended that an overall flood relief scheme should be advanced in three phases, the first being works in Clanmoyle Estate. The Office of Public Works (OPW) agreed to fund the implementation of this phase. DCC is the Contracting Authority for the scheme and the work on this section of the scheme was carried out primarily by the OPW's direct labour force. Phase 1 (Clonmoyle/Clontarf Golf Club) of the scheme is now complete.
